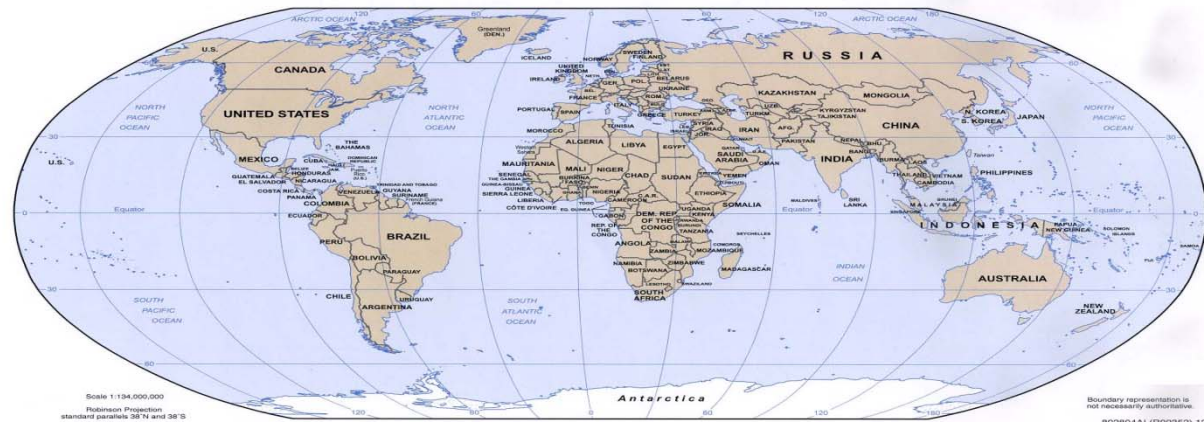

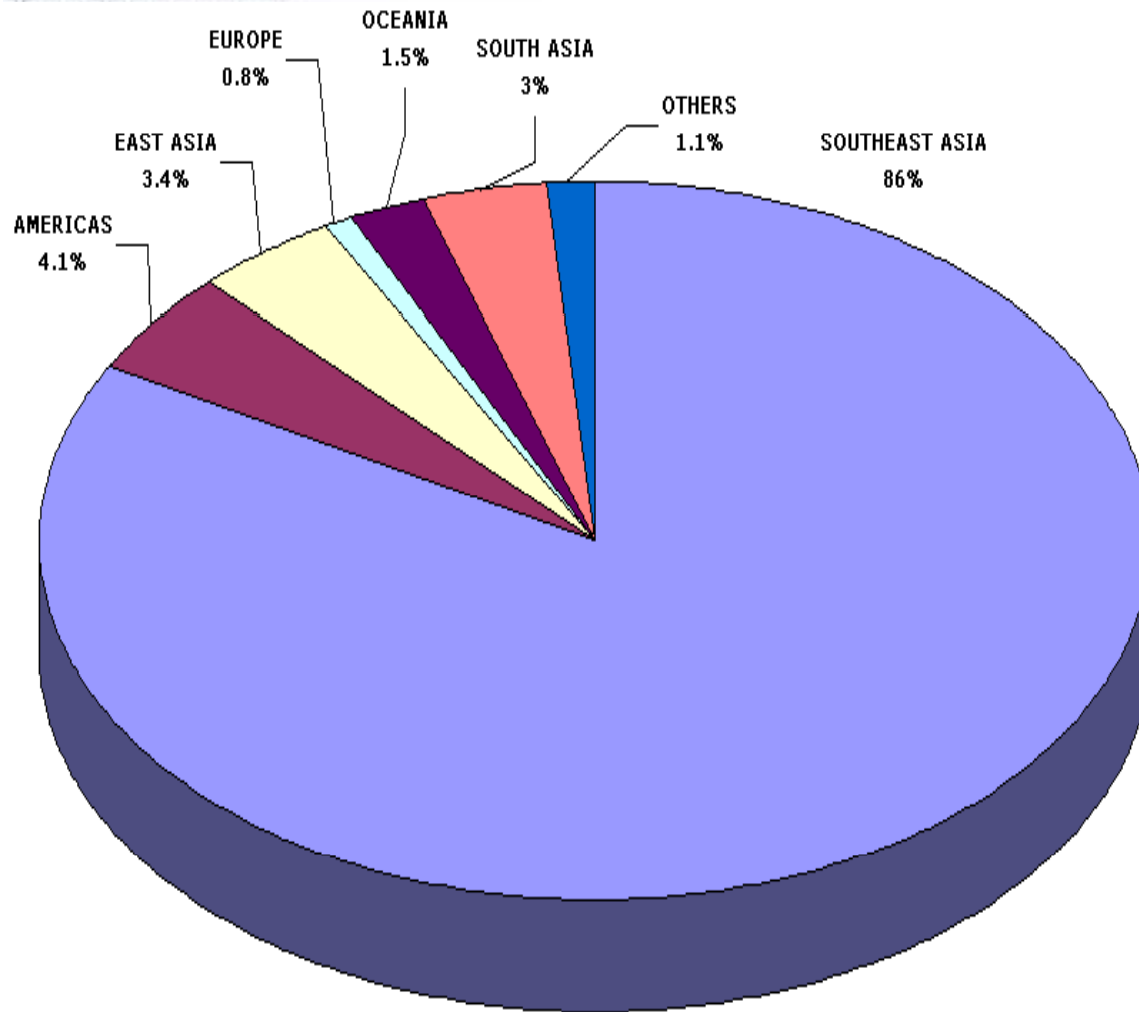


Scale 1:134,000,000
